Dear Orchid Friends and Customers,

People have been planting in their gardens non-stop since June and our local plant nurseries have been doing a fabulous turnover.

I have not been able to import from Carter & Holmes this year due to the Corona virus and will put in an order for 2021 as soon as the flights are more regular. Hopefully, we will have a big show next year in South Africa with overseas vendors and I can then stock up on the more exotic orchids for my customers. I am sure by then we will all want to get together as orchid enthusiasts and hopefully Covid 19 is then a thing of the past.

Local nursery news is that I did move the nursery to its new location in January of 2020. I am only 2 kilometres from the Ark as the crow flies, so weather conditions are very similar. The plants are all doing well in their sheltered environment and a first for many years is that they are all growing without any heat during the winter. What a saving for me! I can't see there is any plant that was seriously upset by the cold, and now that it is near to mid-summer, I can almost say that the Paphiopedilums are looking better than they ever have!

For the first time now, I have a small accessories sales room in the house at no. 34 so it's much easier for customers to browse and select what they need. I have also secured an abundant supply of good quality bark – at great expense due to the haulage costs – and I always have my Cymbidium/Cattleya mix and Orchid Seedling mix in stock. Local customers can also buy this at the Norga River Nursery near to the George Airport if convenient for them. I also supply a few orchids for sale for people to purchase at times other than the open Wednesday morning.

Wishing you all the best for a fabulous and healthy orchid growing year in 2021!

D/o	<p><b><i>Aerangis modesta</i></b> A small sized Madagascan and Comoran species. It is a warm growing epiphyte which blooms in the spring to early summer on pendant stems with fragrant minty scented, long lived flowers. Mounted.</p>		175.00
TSG	<p><b><i>Amesiella monticola</i></b> Found in central Luzon, one of the northern Philippine islands, this small plant bears inflorescences of up to 3 flowers about 6cm across and has a nectary 11cm long. Small plants. 8cm pots.</p>		295.00
9927	<p><b><i>Angraecum sesquipedale</i></b> <b>'Farris' x 'Orchidglade II'</b> <b>FCC/AOS</b> Known as Darwin's orchid, this species has huge blooms in early summer with a long spur. Vigorous young plants in 9cm Disa pots from Carter and Holmes. Can be grown into large plants, spectacular for Spring shows! 9cm pots.</p>		295.00
O/o	<p><b><i>Ansellia africana</i></b> Known as the 'leopard orchid' this epiphyte is found in the summer rainfall areas of southern Africa. 10cm pots.</p>		150.00
D/o	<p><b><i>Arpophyllum giganteum</i></b> From Mexico, Nicaragua, Jamaica, this plant is found as a medium to large sized, warm to cool growing epiphyte at elevations of 800-1500m. D/o	<p><b><i>Bletilla striata</i></b>  The Hyacinth Orchid/Chinese Ground Orchid.  This terrestrial orchid is native to Japan, Korea and China. It is commonly found growing in clumps alongside grassy slopes with sandy soil. Spring blooming lavender flowers.  15cm pots</p>		175.00
9279 9280 9676	<p><b><i>Brassavola digbyana</i></b>  ('Crestwood Emerald' x 'Belize no. 2') ('Belize' #1 x self) ('Belize no. 2' x 'Crestwood Emerald')  Now known as <i>Rhyncolaelia</i> this warm growing epiphyte from Mexico through to Costa Rica grows at elevations up to 1,000m.  Inflorescence bears a single, lemon scented flower in summer. Vigorous in 9cm pot.</p>		325.00
10167	<p><b><i>Cattleya amethystoglossa</i></b>  'El Camino' AM/AOS x self  This tall growing species from Brazil appreciates bright light with a distinct winter rest to flower properly. 

A/o	<p><b><i>Epidendrum xanthinium</i></b> Yellow form from Colombia and Brazil. Cool to hot growing, can become large plants. 12.5 cm pots. (Photo of normal yellow Epi.)</p>		145.00
D/o	<p><b><i>Epidendrum porpax</i> (peperomia)</b> Warm to cool growing dwarf epiphyte found in Colombia and Venezuela. It has clustered leafy stems that can bloom at any time. E36	<p><b><i>Masdevallia striatella</i></b>  Mini-miniature species from Costa Rica, Panama etc. Grows in lower montane cloud forests on tree trunks. D/o	<p><b><i>Maxillaria porphyrostele</i></b>  Found in Brazil as a med sized, hot to cool growing epiphyte that blooms in late fall and winter on 12cm long, single flowered inflorescences. Long lasting flowers are fragrant. 9cm pots</p>		195.00
O/o	<p><b><i>Maxillaria tenuifolia</i></b>  This warm growing epiphyte is found from Mexico to Costa Rica. It has an ascending growth habit and flowers form on mature pseudobulbs during spring and summer. Commonly known as the 'coconut orchid' due to its strong scent. 9cm pots.</p>		125.00
D/o	<p><b><i>Myoxanthus seripetalus</i></b>  Triangular shaped flowers in red/maroon with spots. Mounted.</p>		185.00
D/o	<p><b><i>Neobenthamia gracilis</i></b>  Found in Tanzania as a giant sized, hot to warm growing terrestrial or lithophyte from 380-2000m with branched, erect or straggly stems often forming keikies. It has a 12.5cm inflorescence with fragrant flowers held in a spherical head. Mounted.</p>		175.00
D/o	<p><b><i>Neobenthamia gracilis</i>  (<i>Polystachya neobenthamia</i>)</b>  Best in a bark mix. Blooms winter through to spring. Potted in 9cm Disa pots. Larger plants on request.</p>		95.00
O/o	<p><b><i>Oncidium sphacelatum</i></b>  Delightful, easy to grow species which blooms in mid-summer will long spikes and many yellow/brown blooms. Large plants are in 20cm pots and some beautiful plants in wooden baskets. All blooming size.</p>		250.00

O/o	<p><b><i>Phragmipedium humboltii</i></b>  Small sized humus epiphyte with a short stem and medium to dark green leaves that blooms in spring and summer with a 25cm long, 2 – 4 simultaneous flowered inflorescence holding flowers well above the leaves. 15cm pots, near blooming size.</p>		795.00

TSG	<p><b><i>Sedirea japonica</i> (<i>Phalaenopsis japonica</i>)</b>  Found in Japan as a small sized, cool to cold growing species with a short stem that blooms on an 18cm long, curved, successively 6 – 10 flowered inflorescence. Pot in a coarse, fast draining medium. 8cm pots.</p>		295.00
CSB	<p><b><i>Sobralia macrantha alba</i> 'Angelique'</b>  This orchid was discovered in 1841 and is very easy to grow in cultivation. The flowers are large and pristine white arising from terminal inflorescences and lasting 1-2 days. The flowers open successively so plants can remain in bloom for a long period. Very lrg plants.</p>		550.00
CSB	<p><b><i>Sobralia macrantha</i></b>  A large sized terrestrial, intermediate growing species from Mexico and surrounding countries. Flowers occur from spring till autumn with fragrant, short-lived flowers. Blooming size 17 cm pots.</p>		350.00
